The Certified Medical Assistant (CMA) program trains students to perform a variety of clerical duties and assist with clinical situations in a health-related setting. Students in this program will develop an in-depth knowledge of conceptual, professional, and medical skills.

SKILLS FOR THE JOB

CMAs may find careers in doctor's offices, clinics, and other healthcare facilities. According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, the job outlook is projected to grow 23 percent by 2028, which is much faster than the average job growth. The median pay for CMAs is \$33,610 per year.

EARNING YOUR CERTIFICATION

Upon completion of the degree, graduates can take the CCMA/CMAA exam through the National Healthcareer Association. Students will also be eligible to sit for the Certified Phlebotomy Technician and Certified EKG Technician tests.
