Graduates of the Computer Security & Forensics Certificate will be able to investigate computer crimes and incidents and accurately analyze and report findings.

The program will emphasize the safe acquisition and examination of digital evidence in a way that doesn't alter or damage original evidence. Students will explore file systems operations, deleted data and artifact recovery, and learn how that can be used to build a court case.

According to the U.S. Department of Labor's Bureau of Labor Statistics Occupational Outlook Handbook, the field of computer security and forensics is projected to grow much faster than the average field with excellent job prospects.

The increasing adoption of mobile technologies means more companies will use the Internet to conduct business online. Systems administrators who can help organizations use technology to communicate with employees, clients and consumers will be in demand as will those who can protect information. As cyber attacks become more sophisticated, demand will increase for workers with security skills.
