

A 64 credit-hour Parole Officer degree D392

The two Corrections options were developed in collaboration with the Illinois Department of Corrections as a statewide program. The statewide designation ensures that IDOC employees enrolled in either the Parole Officer or the Youth Supervisor option can easily transition between correctional institutions and community colleges and can complete their Associate in Applied Science Degree in a seamless fashion.

These programs are open to all students. Proficiency credit may be awarded to eligible IDOC employees only.



# **Career Preparations**

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics within the U.S. Department of Labor, opportunities for correctional officers are expected to be good.

Some employment opportunities also will arise in the private sector, as public authorities contract with private companies to provide and staff corrections facilities.
