Medical Assistant

A two-year occupational degree and one-year certificate are available.

This curriculum is designed to meet accreditation standards of the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs (CAAHEP).

Students entering the field perform clerical duties and assist in clinical situations normally associated with medical offices, clinics and other health-related settings.

While specific job duties vary, medical assistants perform clerical duties such as scheduling appointments, preparing and maintaining patient records, arranging hospital admissions, typing reports, processing health insurance forms, ordering supplies, and keeping financial records. Medical assistants also perform clinical tasks such as preparing patients for examinations, taking vital signs, assisting with first aid, collecting and processing specimens.

Students successfully completing the program may be certified in: medical assistant, EKG technician and/or phlebotomy. A background check is required of students enrolled in the program. LTC is a National Testing site for the CMA Certification Exam.

Pharmacy Technician

A 21 credit-hour certificate program.

Pharmacy technicians assist and support licensed pharmacists in providing health care products and medication to patients. They often perform a central role in the preparation and delivery of drug products and act as a liaison for the pharmacist, doctor and patient. Technicians receive and refill prescription requests and verify authenticity and accuracy. They prepare the actual prescriptions, sometimes including the compounding of medication. Additionally, they prepare medication containers and label them. Pharmacy technicians must be registered by the Illinois Department of Professional Regulation.

Employment opportunities exist in hospitals, long-term care units, clinics, mail-order pharmacies, drug wholesalers and retail pharmacies. A background check is required of pharmacy technician students. Students must pass all courses in the curriculum with at least a C to proceed through the program.

This program prepares students with the training, education and skills needed to pass the licensing exam available from the Pharmacy Technician Certification Board and begin entry-level jobs in the profession. LTC is now a National Testing site for the Pharmacy Technician Certification exam.

Electronic Medical Records

A 31 credit-hour certificate program.

Lincoln Trail College prepares students in this program with the training and education necessary to review medical records to ascertain accuracy with regard to treatment procedures and coding, preparation of medical reports and files for long-term storage, electronic compilation of statistics and data for use by other medical personnel, and provision of access to medical information to appropriate parties such as third-party payers and attorneys. Electronic medical records specialists interact little with patients, instead handling patient medical records and reports.

Opportunities for future employment include: hospitals, clinics, health planning agencies, insurance companies, nursing homes, health maintenance organizations, and ambulatory care centers. Lincoln Trail College is now a National Testing site for the CBCS/CMAA/CEHRS exam. Electronic Medical Records students must pass all courses in the program curriculum with at least a C and maintain a minimum term GPA of 2.0 to proceed through the program.

Students successfully completing the program are eligible to take the CEHRS test, CBCS test and CMAA test.
