


The Welding Program was developed to provide industry skills to prepare graduates for employment in the field of welding, as well as complement skills and requirements for other industrial/manufacturing programs.

Instruction will include types and use of equipment and materials, skill performance, safety and blueprint reading.

## **Career Preparations**

Graduates are prepared for entry-level employment in industry. Students already working in an industrial setting will receive the training necessary to advance in their current position.


