

## INDUSTRIAL MAINTENANCE TECHNOLOGY



The Industrial Maintenance Technology program is designed to train students for employment and advancement in today's technologically advanced industrial workplace. The program provides students with a progression of three certificates that leads to the degree. In addition, students complete courses in "Selected Technical Studies" which include welding, machine trades, process control, and other technical greas.

The program also provides current industry employees the opportunity to complete course requirements while maintaining a work schedule.

During the program, students study pneumatics, hydraulics, relay controls, motor controls, robotics, mechatronics, welding, refrigeration, and programmable logic controls including Allen-Bradley, Siemens, and Mitsubishi.

Most IMT classes are hybrid courses, which allow students to complete some coursework at home or in the computer lab while still maintaining face-to-face contact with the instructor.

Refineries, power plants, manufacturers, and even hospitals need technicians with mechanical, electrical, and PLC training to keep their facilities running. The certificate and degree programs qualify graduates for control technician, machine maintenance, and electrical positions or advancement in these various industries.

Students may choose to continue their education at a four-year university. Coursework included in the IMT Degree transfers to Southern Illinois University's Applied Engineering and Industrial Management Degree. Students can complete all but the 42 credit hours of degree-specific classes at OCC.
